(We are required to provide photocopied evidence that a microchip was inserted prior to vaccination for Rabies for the AHC – this can be a Pet Passport or from veterinary records or microchipping companies records)

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Tapeworm treatment is required when travelling with dogs (not cats or ferrets) from Great Britain to EU listed tapeworm free countries including Northern Ireland, Malta, Ireland, and Finland. These dogs must be treated for tapeworm not more than 120 hours (5 days) and not less than 24 hours before time of entry into one of these countries. Please select one of the following options to confirm if your dog requires tapeworm treatment before travel.

Before returning to Great Britain dogs must be treated for tapeworm not more than 120 hours (5 days) and not less than 24 hours before time of entry except for returns from NI, Malta, Ireland, Finland, or Norway. This must be done by an EU vet who must also certify this in the relevant section of the AHC.

If you are leaving Great Britain on a short trip lasting less than 24 hours you must have this treatment prior to leaving and if you are returning within 120 hours (5 days) you can have this treatment before leaving.

Please provide high quality scans or photographs of relevant paperwork so these can be used for the AHC. All original documents will need to be seen at your appointment or the AHC will not be able to be issued.
